



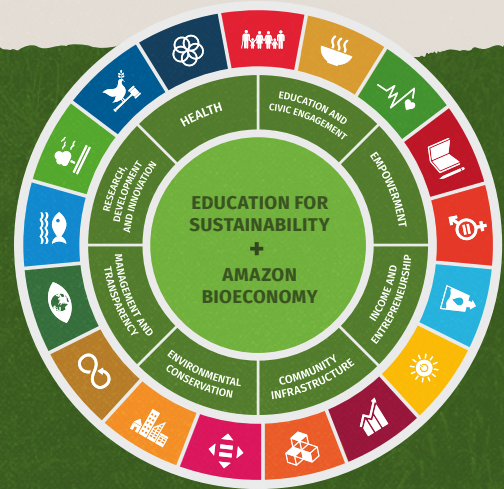

installed in 22 municipalities, serving 2,305 people and training 999 health professionals.

5 territories came out of poverty line

and 202% increase in the family income of residents due to the payment system for environmental services, a public policy implemented by FAS in Amazonas.

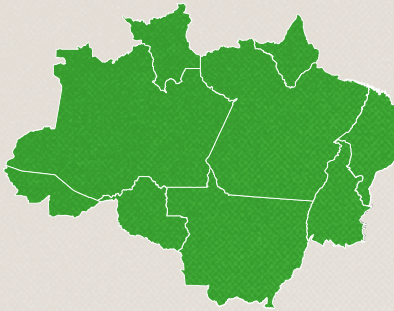
